

## County Clerk Verification of Election Results – under Penalty of Perjury

### Background:

Ultimately the county election administrators are responsible for the accuracy of the election results in each county, then the county commissioners certify the election. The county's results are sent to the state for certification by the state auditor, the state attorney general and the head of public instruction - or others as described in the state law. The election system is broken, but we have to put the pressure where it belongs - right at the beginning of the process with the clerk.

If the clerk signs the document, ask for a list of the people who voted on November 8, 2022. You can generally find invalid votes on that list because we believe every county in the country has them. If the clerk does not sign the document, ask the county commissioners how they can certify the election. If they certify the election anyway, citizens can publicize their actions. The same form can be sent to the Secretary of State before the state results are certified.

If citizens will present the document to their county clerks and to the Secretary of State, it may produce evidence that to help people understand the enormity of the problem. And perhaps put pressure on those considering certification of the county and state results, not to continue to perpetuate a broken system. Several weeks ago we sent copies of the Montana 2020 Election Canvass Report, cover letter and a bookmark which summarized the categories of reasons to consider decertifying an election to nearly 500 people in Montana including all of the state top elected officials, all of the legislators, all of the county commissioners, all of the sheriffs, and all of the county clerks. The report shows a conservative 120,261 or 19.6% invalid votes, in the 2022 General Election, and we believe they are in every Montana county, and probably have been for many years. They now know there is evidence that no elections should be certified.

Perhaps others around the country could use the template below to create a letter to their county clerks. The courts may never address this issue in a timely fashion, but the Court of Public Opinion can act quickly and directly when they see the evidence that elections have been "certified" in the past with no reasonable basis. Until the election system and infrastructure is changed and citizens have complete confidence in their integrity, no elections should be certified again.
