

• Why it's Important to Vote for the Worst Republican Over the Best Democrat!

The single most important vote most legislators (both state and federal) cast isn't on taxes, spending, or even a major bill. That's why many voters focus first on which party will control the chamber. Lose the majority, and it doesn't matter how much you love your individual legislator—they become part of the minority, with far less ability to shape what happens.

Think of it this way- without a Republican Speaker or Leader, we would never get bills, hearings or investigations on border security, lower taxes, energy production, public safety, deep state corruption, Fraud, Waste and Abuse, etc. Instead, with Democrat control we'd get expansive trans and child gender mutilation protections, boys in girls sports, priorities for illegal aliens, defunding ICE, climate alarmism policy, bigger government, impeachment after impeachment of Trump and his current admin.
